

OUR NEXT ADVENTURE IN FAITH



During Hill Country's 38 years, we've embarked on many adventures in faith where we've fully trusted God to shepherd and provide for us. This year was no exception. Last fall, we began the search for the next lead pastor of Hill Country Bible Church. After much prayer, fasting, and an extensive interview process, our elders unanimously believed they found the person God called to our church — Tim Kuhl. The elders invited Tim to be our new Lead Pastor, and the members overwhelmingly affirmed the elders' hiring of Tim.

The process that led us to Pastor Tim was deeply rooted in prayer. Our elders, a group of nine men who played an integral role in the process, are committed to leading our church according to 1 Peter 5:2-3. Called to care for God's people and lead them, our elders dedicate countless hours of prayer and service to Hill Country.

As we welcome Tim Kuhl to Hill Country, we thank Tim Hawks and his wife Cindy for consistently modeling how it looks to passionately follow Jesus, love people, and share the gospel. Tim's faithful leadership over the past 35 years will continue to positively influence how we, as a church, seek to saturate Greater Austin — and beyond — with the love of Jesus.



ONE CHURCH TEAMS

Last year, we refocused our *one-church-in-multiple-locations* model, creating greater unity and living out Ephesians 4. Committed to unleashing people to live out God's calling for them to make an impact, we saw 153 people accept the call to be a part of a One Church Team. These teams lead their respective ministries across all locations to help advance the gospel.

For example, the Church Planting One Church Team is one of the teams making a huge impact in our city and beyond. Having established a church-planter development pipeline, each member of the team has an assigned area of focus in the pipeline that aligns with their personal gifting.







ENGAGING GENERATIONS

We think past our individual life stages, extend connections, and build bridges. We are committed to being a church that ministers to all ages, supporting effective ministry to all seasons of life.

We have a place for people of all ages and stages of life to belong, whether they're in a small group with others in their same season or they're a mature adult serving the next generation.

This is particularly important in a culture that's running fast in the opposite direction of Jesus. One way we do this at Hill Country is with our Courageous Parenting Community, which is committed to being disciples of Christ and raising kids who are disciples of Christ rather than products of the culture. Within this community, Courageous Parents are making the brave, counter-cultural choices and forging the supportive community necessary to grow kids and families who stand out with the love and character of Jesus rather than fit in. In our first wave of Courageous Parents, we have **250** parents (126 family units) and **26** mentor-leaders, making **21** groups. We anticipate adding another **110** parents (55 family units) and **20** more mentor-leaders, making approximately **10** more groups.

Offering Counseling & Support

Approximately **1,040** adults and **310** students attended the Holy Sexuality and the Gospel Conference with Christopher Yuan, who provided practical wisdom for anyone in the LGBTQ community, as well as anyone experiencing same-sex attraction.

Provided **3,610** counseling sessions to individuals seeking biblical support and guidance

Responding to God's Call to Serve

397 people responded to both God's call and the change in their own life to begin serving on Sunday morning.

CELEBRATING LIFE CHANGE

God has greatly changed our lives, and we want everyone to experience His life-changing love. We intentionally share the good news of Jesus and help others follow Him, celebrating as God transforms lives.

At Hill Country, we believe that life-change is something to be celebrated. One way we celebrate God at work is through baptisms.

Publicly Proclaiming Faith Through Baptisms

This year, **178** adults and students took this important, public step in their faith journey.

A story of life-change involves Lori and her sister Kim. Lori had been attending Hill Country online, when she felt a nudge to re-engage and get baptized. Excited about her baptism, she invited her sister Kim to attend church on that day to celebrate. Kim was reluctant to come to church; however, through a series of conversations with Lori she not only came to experience her sister's baptism, but she decided to be baptized that day, too.

Accepting Jesus as Their Lord and Savior

God moved the hearts of **380** people during Great Adventure, the SXSW event, and Hill Country's Benevolence Ministry, leading them to place their faith in Jesus.

THINKING BEYOND OURSELVES

We are passionate about seeing the gospel saturate our families, our communities, and our world. We adapt ourselves to the needs around us — looking for opportunities to stretch ourselves, giving generously, and yielding to God's desire to expand. We believe the good news of Jesus is meant to be shared both locally and around the world.

Sharing the Love of Jesus Through Strategic Events

3,500 people attended a SXSW event where Hill Country engaged with teams on the ground, served on the Advisory Committee, provided financial support, and partnered with churches in Greater Austin through prayer. We're celebrating the **100** gospel decisions.

249,012 total prayers recorded for neighbors, with **523** gospel shares in the BLESS Every Home platform

Roughly **7.6 million** virtual invitations to learn about Hill Country

Reaching the Nations for Christ

We're committed to equipping and deploying the people of Hill Country to personally engage in the Great Commission to make disciples of all nations, focusing on the unreached.

\$716,072 given to global mission partners

727 adult servant leaders, with **179** of those serving for the first time at Great Adventure



LOVING OUR NEIGHBORS CONT'D.

Impacting Our Community Through Education Initiatives

With schools in every local neighborhood, we have a tremendous opportunity to reach many neighbors in the name of Jesus by serving the students and families in these schools.

Through Education Connection, **186** literacy partners from our church are reading weekly with **558** students in over five districts in our community.

This year, **3,213** LISD students were given new backpacks filled with school supplies through Backpack Attack. More than **100** servant leaders were involved in planning, unpacking, assembling, and distributing backpacks.

“Three out of my four students who had a weekly literacy partner experienced positive growth. One grew more confident as a reader; one saw a huge increase in reading ability; and one was provided with an outlet for communication. Our literacy partners are invaluable to our school!”

Ministering to Those with Spiritual and Physical Needs

God calls us to minister to the least of these and allows our relationships with others to be an avenue to help meet their spiritual and physical needs.

Through our partnership with Reveal Resource Center, we helped provide food to **22,178** families and **83,902** individuals, and diapers to **7,175** families, with more than **100** servant leaders serving with this ministry.

In partnership with two other local churches, servant leaders from our church family came together for a Feed My Starving Children initiative to assemble **272,000** packs of food to feed **746** children in Guatemala for the year.

276 families and children were given Christmas gifts through Tree of Lights.


Our Benevolence Ministry had **290** appointments, gifted **\$424,113** to individuals and benevolent ministries, and led **three** people to faith in Jesus.






FINANCIAL SUMMARY
