SMALL GROUP ATTENDANCE APP

Regular and accurate attendance records for each small group is critical to our ministry. It is very important that each Small Group leader keep their roster up to date. To facilitate that, Hill Country's technology provider, TouchPoint, is in the process of developing an app that will be used church wide. The app, currently in a beta program, will be released to the app stores in 2023* and is tailored to our Small Group needs.

We strongly encourage all Small Group leaders to begin using the app to:

- Take attendance including adding guests
- Manage your group roster
- Move guests to member status
- · Remove people from your group

Below are instructions, hints, and tips that will facilitate use of the app.

*Note: As of the time time of the printing of this guide, the app has not yet been released to the Apple and Google app stores. We anticipate that happening early in 2023.





Installling the App:



- Download the app from either the Apple App Store or the Google Play Store. Search for "Hill Country Bible Church." "TouchPoint" is listed as the developer. Apple users must be on iOS 16.1 or newer.
- · Sign in by clicking the "Sign In" avatar circle below the Hill Country logo, then choose how you want to receive your sign in code. Follow the prompts. You will be directed to create a PIN. If prompted for


a username and/or password, refer to the welcome email you received previously.

• If you have trouble using the app, contact Lori (lorimoritz@hcbc.com).

Taking Attendance:

- Select the "hamburger" menu (the 3 horizontal lines) in the upper right corner of the app home page.
- Select "Attendance".
- Select the appropriate attendance entry.
- · For each member in attendance, tap on their name. When you do, the red "X" will change to a green checkmark. Once all in attendance have a green checkmark, you may exit the app. It is not necessary to choose a submit button as the attendance will have been already submitted.

Adding a Guest:

• To add a guest, select "Add Guest" in the upper right corner of the Attendance page. Enter the person's name and select "Search." If the person is listed in our church database, their record information will be shown. Select the record and they will be added under the "Guests" category with their attendance marked with a green checkmark.

• If the person is not listed in our church database, you will not be able to add them. Please contact Kelly (kellylawson@hcbc.com) or Lori (lorimoritz@hcbc.com) to add them mannually to the database. Please provide their name, address, and phone number.



- Changing a Guest to a Member: We suggest after someone attends your group 3 times they be considered a member of your small group.

 To change them from guest to member, press and hold the guest's name then select "Join." The person is now moved under the "Members" listing.
- Removing a Member: Press and hold the member's name then select "Drop." The person will either be removed altogether or they may move down to the 'Guests' listing in that week's attendance. In either case, they will not be on the following week's roster.*
- Removing a Guest: First change the person to a member (see above) then follow the procedure for removing a member.

*Note: Group rosters are managed within any given week's attendance entry. This leads to some unusual handling, but does work. There may be changes in this area before the beta app is final.

• The Resources section available from the Home screen will allow you to access the weekly Small Group sermon discussion questions

MULTIPLICATION

The Long Term Path for Small Group Growth

Why multiply? When we consider the example of Jesus as a small group leader of sorts, even the Savior limited His tight group of disciples to twelve. Beyond this, He challenged these followers to go out and multiply in the genesis of the early church.

We must remember our calling as Hill Country Small Group leaders, not just to connect and grow, but also to BLESS. We must maintain an outwardly open posture, resisting the urge to tighten our circle and only look inward.

For many small group leaders, the concept of multiplying can be intimidating or threatening. We end up thinking the goal for our groups is to stay together indefinitely and become an inward-focused group of friends that lasts for years.

The Limitations of Large Small Groups:

Over time, with slow natural growth, eventually a group that resists multiplying will grow too bulky and unwieldy. Simple math shows that the more people in a group, the less time each individual will have to share about his or her life. This just becomes more and more problematic as a group grows larger. How can a leader give adequate personal care with a group that swells larger and larger? Imagine a guest's experience joining a group and feeling like a spectator because there's no room to get a word in edgewise.

The Solution - Multiplication

The

Long Play



Keep multiplication on the table from the start. Establish early in a group's life-cycle or bring the concept into an existing group, that the goal in the future will be to continue adding more and more people to get to the point of multiplying for greater effectiveness in the community.

The Language Split vs. Divide vs. Multiply. Even the wording we use matters. The concepts of "splitting" or "dividing" a small group have a negative connotation. When we talk about multiplication, it's clear that we are pursuing saturating Greater Austin with the love of Jesus!

MULTIPLICATION DONE WELL

Chuck & Libby Barber - "We made it clear to everyone that we wanted to see the group grow in size and then multiply new small groups. We discussed this often in the group and whenever we added new people we re-cast our vision to multiply. Essentially, we normalized small group multiplication just by talking about it all the time! Our one group has now turned into three."

Doug & Michelle James – On reuniting with generations of multiplied groups that emerged from their initial group: "One time we got together and had over 150 people there. That was exciting! I think this is what Jesus modeled for us and calls us to do. Let's do what Jesus did."

Harlan & Stephanie Stewart - "We believe and understand that multiplying our group provides new opportunities for outsiders (those not in community) to share in authentic Christian relationships. Continuing to add new members to our group no matter the size adds new energy, perspective, conversation, and diversity which becomes fresh air and allows us to move towards multiplying. I am not saying this is easy because it isn't. We LOVE all of our small group members and are sad when we are not in weekly community together. However, someone reminded us that it would have been really easy for Jesus's disciples to remain in their group after He left them. They had grown to know each other, they knew each others weaknesses, and they had experienced things together that were unique to their relationships. God had another plan as we read in Matthew 28:18-20 as Jesus commissioned His disciples to go and make other disciples.

"We are still growing and learning in the process having multiplied three times now in the last 5 years. As a group our goal needs to be "to multiply" and will be a good reminder of one of the reasons for the small group in addition to forging relationships. Hopefully this goal will provide a source of unity for our group and allow us to work together providing opportunity for individual growth and potential leadership and service to others through our multiplying efforts.

"We have learned that small groups have a life span and that is okay. We want our group to live and breathe but we pray about and try to be aware when it is time to mix things up by multiplying. Sometimes the size of our group makes the timing decision for us.

"God put us in front of Doug and Michelle James at the beginning of our time at Hill Country and they showed us how this works. Even though it hasn't always felt good, we have seen the fruit it has produced and we have grown spiritually through it. We know that spiritual and personal growth is hard but every one of us can do it with His help and we rely on Him daily."

Nineteen of the 59, or fully one third, call for loving one another! Add to these commands the many other scriptures that describe the role of caring. One Bible writer, for instance, marvels at how Christ's forgiveness gives rise to true "fellowship with one another" (1 John 1:7). Another thanks God for the maturity whereby "the love every one of you has for each other is increasing" (2 Thess. 1:3).



Our Mission

God put us where we are for a specific reason – to play a significant part in his plan to see all people enter into a living, eternal relationship with himself.

We will make significant progress in God's mission if each of us embraces a personal and intentional strategy for witnessing based on the life and example of Jesus Christ. What Jesus did, and equipped his disciples to do, can be summarized by the acronym **BLESS**.

BLESS Every Home

BlessEveryHome.com gives you the tools to become a Light for Christ in your neighborhood. Join an ever-growing community of Christ followers who are devoted to being a Light in their neighborhoods through praying for, caring for, sharing the gospel and discipling their neighbors. It's free and confidential.

What is BLESS? BLESS is an acronym for five life patterns that Jesus and his early disciples constantly modelled. BLESS defines a good neighbor and friend. We see BLESS as every disciple's approach to influencing people far from God with the love of Jesus Christ.

Every Disciple's Normal On-Going Gospel Influence Activities:

Begin with Prayer

- Praying regularly for the same heart and love for people that Jesus has.
- Praying regularly for people far from God in your spheres of influence (FRANC). (Matthew 9:36-38; Acts 26:29; Romans 10:1; Colossians 4:2-4)

Listen with Care

• Entering spiritual conversations by asking questions, listening and formulating Jesus honoring responses. (John 4:10-26; Acts 8:26-40; Colossians 4:5-6)

Eat Together

 Sharing meals with people who don't yet know Christ personally (Matthew 9:9-13; Luke 11:37; Luke 19:1-10)

Serve with Love

 Serving people and inviting them to help you in different ways. (Mark 10:45; John 4:7; Romans 15:1-3)

Share Your Story and God's Story

- Sharing your salvation story in relevant ways. Speaking opening about your relationship with Christ and sharing how He is influencing your life.
 - (Mark 5:19-20; John 4:28, 39-41; John 9:25; Acts 26:1-23)
- Sharing a simple Gospel illustration clearly and inviting people to trust and follow Jesus Christ. (Acts 2:36-41; Romans 10:8-11; 1 Corinthians 15:1-11)

Why Make Disciples?

There's a lot to do in life and we have a lot of responsibilities, so how can we be sure that we don't miss the most important things? Imagine sitting down with Jesus and asking, "Jesus, what should be the primary focus of my life?" Jesus would say something like, "Out of your love for God and your neighbor, I want you to go and make

Matthew 28:18-20 "Then Jesus came to them and said, 'All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Therefore, go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely, I am with you always, to the very end of the age."

Regardless of the career you've chosen, your calling is bigger! Your purpose is to be a part of God's plan for reaching the world for Christ. The Great Commission of Jesus Christ is to MAKE DISCIPLES OF ALL THE NATIONS.

What is a Disciple?

A Fully Formed Follower of Christ. The apostle Paul put it this way:



Galatians 4:19 "My dear children, for whom I am again in the pains of childbirth until Christ is formed in you…"

Paul "labored," which is to say, "he worked hard" to see Jesus formed in others. That's what it means to be a disciple – to have Jesus formed in our lives.

FULLY FORMED FOLLOWERS

Fully Formed Followers of Jesus understand what Christ has done for them (Grace), who they are in Christ (Identity), and have set their hearts to pattern their lives after Christ's until they look and live like Jesus (Life Patterns).




What characteristics are we working hard to form in others? There are many indicators, but after reflecting on the words of Scripture and their own lives, the pastors and elders at Hill Country

Bible Church concluded there are four basic identities with corresponding life patterns that encompass the core characteristics of a follower of Jesus.

- Worshiper: Disciples grow in their devotion to God and away from devotion to anything else.
- Witness: Disciples faithfully share the good news of Jesus with others and see people come to faith in Christ.
- Servant: Disciples know how God has gifted them and they use their gifts to serve
- **Disciple Maker:** Disciples understand their primary ministry calling and disciple others to become fully formed followers of Jesus.
