# OUTCOMES AND RESULTS - SUCCESS IN THIS POSTION WILL RESULT IN:

- 1. The vision to be a movement of changed lives that impacts greater Austin and beyond is visibly seen in the lives of interns.
- 2. Students are growing as fully formed followers of Christ they receive their identify from Jesus and are modeling their life after His.
- 3. More students across all locations are coming to faith, growing in Christ-like character, and being discipled to be life-long disciple makers.

# MAJOR RESPONSIBILITES AND ACTIVITES:

- 1. Commit to a vibrant, daily walk with Christ model our definition of a fully formed follower of Christ (one who receives their identity from Jesus and models their life after His).
- 2. Work closely with the Student Ministry team and support them in the overall vision for Student Ministries across all locations.
- 3. Meet weekly with Intern Coordinator to for direction and check-ins for spiritual vitality
- 4. Engage with students in intentional personal ministry.
- 5. Lead students in ministry environments.
- 6. Participate in Intern Learning Communities, and complete any assignments.
- 7. Assist in the execution of aspects of the Great Adventure (Boot Camp, Back Yard Bible Clubs) as they pertain to interns.
- 8. Ensure that midweek Middle and High School events assigned to interns are sufficiently planned, communicated, and executed.
- 9. Model an intentional approach to gospel saturation ensuring that those where you live, work, and play have opportunities to see and know Jesus; lead and equip interns/students to do the same.
- 10. Work alongside the SM team to connect students into Small Groups and discipleship relationships.

# REQUIRED KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS, AND ABILITIES:

- 1. Passion and gifting of shepherd/disciple maker; proven ability to equip, empower, develop, and partner with leaders, parents, students, and adults.
- 2. Self-starter with strong work ethic and excellent time-management skills.
- 3. Organizational strength.
- 4. Availability to work on Sundays, after hours, extended hours, and ministry events that take place in evenings, overnight, and/or over the course of a weekend or week.
- 5. Ability to lift 20+ lbs, walk large campus area, perform physical activities.

# **Program Overview**

The Student Ministry Summer Internship is designed to develop leaders who are passionately committed to investing in the next generation. The internship creates an environment that provides a balance between personal ministry equipping and practical experience to continue development for a life of ministry. This intern program is designed to provide training and opportunities for youth ministry experience within the framework of Hill Country Bible Church Austin. Our desire is for interns to experience the inner workings of a youth ministry in a large multi-site church setting. This internship is not only for those who plan to go into ministry as a profession but is also for those who plan on making ministry an everyday part of their walk with Christ.

Interns' time will be divided as follows:

#### 25% of your time:

- Intern Learning Community This time will be spent intentionally developing you as a leader, give you the opportunity to share what you are learning with the other interns, and grow together.
- Mentored by Intern Coordinators
- · Accountability with another intern

#### 30% of your time:

- Staff Meetings & Leadership Development Gather with our HCBC staff to celebrate how God is working, worship, and pray, as well as participate in ongoing leadership development.
- Planning and executing High School and Middle School Events
- Administrative responsibilities for summer programs
- Sunday morning responsibilities

#### 45% of your time:

• Investing in the next generation by connecting with students one-on-one or in smaller groups to discover these three questions: Who are they? Where are they spiritually? How can you help them take their next step?

#### **RESPONSIBILITIES**

- 1. Discipleship: Each intern will build an influence group of approximately 20 students which they mentor/disciple and connect with regularly to help them take their next steps spiritually (both Middle and High School).
- 2. Leadership: All interns have ownership of planning, organizing, and executing ministry programming at Middle School and High School events.
- 3. Attend all student ministry events including meetings, evening activities, worship services, etc. Interns will help coordinate and lead weekly gatherings for both Middle School and High School.
- 4. Study: Interns will be equipped and challenged to grow spiritually as they meet weekly in learning community, leadership development activities, time with Intern Coordinators, and accountability partners.
- 5. Administration: Interns will be trained in all aspects of ministry leadership. The intern will spend adequate time each week planning and coordinating for successful ministry.

#### PERSONAL INVESTMENT

Interns will have a weekly Learning Community with one another and their Intern Coordinators that includes time with Hill Country staff on topics about ministry and life development.

Interns will also have time once a week to meet with an accountability partner (another intern of the same gender) off-campus to pray for each other and connect.

# HOUSING

If you are not an Austin resident, Hill Country Bible Church will help you find a host home through our various networks. Please let us know if you would like assistance in finding housing during your interview process.

#### **INTERN POLICIES:**

Should you be selected as an intern, it is required that you maintain biblical behavior both inside the workplace and outside the workplace during the internship. Interns who do not comply may be subject to disciplinary action, up to and including termination. While it is impossible to list every situation that may arise, below are a few examples:

- · Operate above reproach in all environments (meeting in public places, having a third person ride in vehicle, if possible, never drive/ride alone with interns of the opposite gender, etc.) and error on the side of caution in all situations. Supervisors can provide further guidance regarding questionable situations.
- · During overnight events, intern should avoid sleeping in the same room with students when possible.
- · Avoid personal Social Media interactions with students (do not "direct message" students, do not add students on Snap Chat, etc.)
- · Drivers 18-21 years of age consent to a driving record background check to ensure there are no safety trend concerns; must have valid and current vehicle insurance coverage; must complete the Automobile Driver Guidelines for HCBC Austin if accepted into program.
- · We do not have specific dress code, but our rule of thumb is towards business casual- recognizing that people of all ages, stages of life and backgrounds visit all our campuses/events throughout the day/evening.
  - For summer, appropriate shorts and lighter weight shirts/clothing are allowed in the work environment and church/student events.
  - Men should avoid overly sloppy or ripped short/ t-shirt and women should avoid short-shorts/skirts/dresses and tops with spaghetti straps
  - o If something is "on the fence"-choose something else

#### **COMPENSATION**

Hill Country Bible Church and you will both participate in providing compensation for the paid internship. Hill Country Bible Church will provide up to \$1,800 in budgeted funds and the intern will raise up to \$1,800 toward total compensation package. If full support is raised, and interns work the maximum approved hours, total compensation will range between \$3,600 and \$4,125 based on the final number of hours worked.

Specifically, interns will be paid a <u>minimum</u> of \$10/hr. until HCBC budgeted funds and raised support are exhausted. Interns will typically work 40 hours per week (all overtime requires pre-approval), during their nine-week program. This amount is to be paid out in accordance with our regularly scheduled payroll.

Ideally, interns should raise \$1,800 by May 25, 2023. If <u>partial</u> support is raised by May 25, 2023, you may begin work and will be paid until the raised support and church-provided salary are exhausted, at which time your paid internship will be converted to an unpaid volunteer position for the remainder of the nine-week internship.

No refunds will be issued. If extra support over \$1,800 is turned in, the funds will be used by the Student Ministry for the Intern team.

A sample support letter can be found on page 6 of this packet. Further details and assistance regarding support raising will be provided upon hiring.

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# **Our Core Beliefs**

#### Introduction

This document outlines the core teaching distinctives of Hill Country Bible Church Austin. As such, they represent what we believe the Bible teaches regarding the key doctrines of the Christian faith.

#### The Bible

We believe that the 66 books of the Old and New Testaments that comprise the Bible are the inspired, inerrant and infallible Word of God. We believe that the Holy Spirit supervised the writers of the Bible in what they wrote so that, using their own unique personalities, the very words recorded in the original manuscripts are the direct revelation of God. We believe the Bible not only contains the Word of God but actually is God's Word and, therefore, is the complete and final authority for belief and behavior. As such, it can be completely trusted. We believe that inspiration, inerrancy, and infallibility extend equally and fully to all parts of Scripture: historically, poetically, doctrinally and prophetically (2 Tim. 3:16, 2 Pet. 1:21, 1 Cor. 2:13, John 17:17).

### God

We believe that there is one and only one true and living God, an infinite Spirit who is the Maker and Supreme Ruler of the universe. We believe the Bible reveals Him to be holy, sovereign, omnipotent, omniscient, omnipresent, eternal, immutable and full of love, justice, goodness, mercy and truth. This is only a representative list of His eternal and unchanging attributes. Although there is only one God, He exists eternally in three persons as the Trinity: the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. We believe these members of the Trinity are coequal in essence, having precisely the same nature, attributes and perfections, but are distinct in subsistence, executing different but harmonious functions (Mark 12:29, John 4:24, Matt. 3:16-17, Matt. 28:19, 2 Cor. 13:14).

# **Jesus Christ**

We believe that Jesus Christ has existed eternally as the Son of God. At a specific point in time, Jesus became a man (the incarnation) in order to reveal God and redeem humanity. We believe He was supernaturally conceived of the Holy Spirit and born of a virgin, Mary. In His incarnation, He forever possesses both full deity and full humanity in such a way that the properties of each nature are fully retained and undiminished by the union. We believe Jesus died on the cross as a substitute for sinful humanity, was buried, rose bodily from the tomb, ascended into Heaven where He ministers on the behalf of those who have trusted in Him, and someday will come again for His own (John 1:18, 8:58, Matt. 1:23, Col. 1:15-17, 1 Tim. 1:15, 3:16).

# **Holy Spirit**

We believe that the Holy Spirit is the third person of the Trinity, fully coequal with God the Father and God the Son in terms of divine being, but distinct from the Father and the Son in His personhood. We believe the Holy Spirit actively ministers to the world. This ministry includes restraining evil, convicting the unsaved of sin and bestowing God's goodness on mankind. We also believe He ministers to every believer in Jesus Christ in numerous ways: regenerating, sealing, indwelling, baptizing into the Body of Christ, and the giving of spiritual gifts. Other ministries to believers include filling, assuring, teaching, guiding and comforting (Acts 5:3-4, 2 Thess. 2:3-9, John 16:7-11, Matt. 5:45, Tit. 3:5, Eph. 1:13, 1 Cor. 6:19, 12:13, Eph. 3:20, 1 Cor. 14, James 5:14, Eph. 5:18, Rom. 8:16, 14, John 16:13, 7).

# Creation

We believe that God, according to His sovereign will and for His own glory, created the heavens and the earth without the use of pre-existent material. We also believe that all living things came into being by the creative act of God and not by a random process. Creation has an existence distinct from Him and yet is always dependent on Him (Gen. 2:4, Prov. 16:4, Acts 17:24, Col. 1:16-17).

# Humanity

We believe that humanity, both male and female, was created in the image and likeness of God. Having been made in God's image, each human life, from conception to natural death, is precious to God. Each human is deserving of equal dignity, value, and worth. Jesus said the greatest commandment is to love God fully and to love our neighbor as we love ourselves. This command has no qualification and extends to each person regardless of their culture, ethnicity, or socio-economic status (Gen. 1:26-27, Deut. 10:17-19, Psalm 139:13-16, Luke 10:25-37, Acts 17:26, Gal.3:28, James 2:1-13, Rev. 5:9-10, 7:9).

# Sin

We believe, though created in a state of innocence, humanity fell from its sinless state and became subject to physical and spiritual death. Sin is anything contrary to the character of God. Every person is alienated from God because of their depraved nature and personal acts of sin. Therefore, everyone is separated from God and completely incapable of meriting salvation and avoiding the judgment of God. Our sinful nature is never eradicated, even for those who have trusted in Christ alone for salvation. It remains until the end of life on earth. However, we believe God has made provision for forgiveness of sin through the blood of Jesus Christ and victory over sin through the power of the indwelling Holy Spirit (Rom. 3:10, 23, 5:12, 6:23, Gal. 5:16-17, Eph. 4:18, 1 John 1:8-10).

# Salvation

We believe that salvation from the penalty and power of sin is available through faith in Jesus Christ alone. This salvation was made possible through the blood of Jesus Christ, which He shed on the cross. It is through this act that He became sin for us and died in our place. There is nothing a person can do to earn this salvation (including good works, moral achievement or religious status). The one and only condition for salvation is personal faith in Jesus Christ as one's own substitute for sin and savior from sin. At the time of salvation, a person is spiritually regenerated, sins are forgiven, God's righteousness is imputed, and he/she is declared righteous in the sight of God. This salvation is complete and a

present possession of all believers which remains his/hers forever. All who have trusted Christ as Savior are kept secure and will never lose their salvation (1 Pet. 1:18-19, 2 Cor. 5:21, 1 Pet. 2:24, Eph 2:8-9, Tit. 3:5, Eph. 4:32, Rom. 5:1, Rom. 8:38-39).

### The Church

We believe that the Church is a unique organism composed of people from every tribe, language, people, and nation who have placed their faith in Christ alone as Savior. The Church began on the day of Pentecost and will continue its distinct purpose until Christ's return. We believe that the Church exists in both a universal aspect, as the Body of Christ, and in a local assembly of believers in Jesus Christ. The local church has the twofold purpose of the edification of believers and the evangelization of the unsaved. We practice water baptism by immersion, and the Lord's Supper, which we believe to be a memorial of Christ's death. Both are open to all believers (Matt. 28:19-20, Acts 2:1-4, 1 Cor. 11:23-28, 1 Cor. 12:13, Eph. 4:7, Col. 4:16, 1 Thess. 4:13-17, Heb. 13:17, Rev. 5:9-10, 7:9).

# Marriage & Sexuality

Marriage is a picture of Christ's relationship with His Bride – the Church. It is defined from the beginning of Scripture as a lifelong covenant between a man and a woman. God designed sexual intimacy for a marriage relationship and does not endorse or condone it in any other context (1 Thess. 4:3-5, Eph. 5:22-23, Gen. 2:24, Matt. 19:4-5).

# **Angelic Beings**

We believe that God created an order of spirit beings (without physical bodies) known as angels, before the formation of the world and for the purpose of worshipping and serving Him. Angels possess individual personalities and are intelligent and powerful. They are inferior to God but superior to humans. These angels (also known as elect or holy angels) carry out the will of God by ministering to humankind (Col. 1:16, Heb. 1:6, 2 Pet. 2:11, Isa. 14:12-15, 1 Pet. 5:8, Eph 6:12, Heb. 1:14).

### **Satan and Demons**

We believe Lucifer was one of the highest ranking of all the angelic beings, but he sinned through pride and rebelled against God, thereby becoming Satan (or the adversary) (Isa. 14:12-20). We believe that Satan's declared purpose is to oppose the plan of God and to promote his own evil designs by deceiving and attacking humanity (2 Cor 4:4, Rev 20:3, Acts 5:3). In carrying out his work, Satan is aided by other fallen angels known as demons or evil spirits (Eph. 6:11-12). We believe these demons can influence and tempt people, exerting a greater degree over unbelievers (Matt 4:24).

# Dispensations\*

We believe that God accomplishes His purposes in the world through and for humanity under varying dispensations or administrations. These administrations are sometimes referred to as the age of the Mosaic Law (former times); the Age of Grace (the present time); and the future millennial kingdom (the time to come). We believe that these dispensations span the entirety of human history but that dispensations are not different ways of salvation. Rather, they are ways of life which test the obedience

of man to God's revealed will during a particular time. We believe that it is necessary to observe the dispensational distinction in order to properly understand the teaching of the Scriptures (1 Cor. 10:32, Eph. 1:10, 3:2, Gal. 4:2, Luke 12:42, Heb. 12:22-23).

# Future Things\*

We believe that the next major event in God's prophetic calendar is the Rapture of the Church. The Rapture will occur when living and dead believers are caught up to meet the Lord and receive rewards at the Judgment Seat of Christ. Following the Rapture, a seven year period of Tribulation (or distress) will commence upon the earth at which time God's wrath will be poured out on mankind. God's millennial kingdom will be ushered in by Jesus Christ when He returns to the earth in power and glory to rule sovereignly over the world for a thousand years. The unsaved dead of all ages will be raised after the millennium to face the final judgment also known as the Great White Throne Judgment. Those who have not trusted in Jesus alone for their salvation will be cast into the lake of fire where there will be eternal and conscious punishment. We believe that the redeemed of all ages will exist in an eternal state of joy and bliss in the new heavens and new earth where they will worship and serve God forever (John 14:3, Heb. 10:37, 2 Cor. 5:10, Matt. 24:21-31, Rev. 20-22).
